#### **Displacement Updates**

While some internally displaced families are still fleeing their homes due to heavy air strikes mainly within the Alshirqat district, others have returned to Salah Al-Din from Kirkuk governorate to seek refuge in the Baiji district. However, movement between Kirkuk and Salah Al-Din is reported to be difficult because of route closures by KRG and local authorities. Due to a lack of staff and medical supplies, hospitals and health centers in various districts are encountering major difficulties in providing services to displaced persons.

Meanwhile, in Baghdad, an additional 450 IDP families have arrived from northern provinces. They are in need of food and shelter and are currently living in mosques, schools and buildings unfit for habitation.

In the south, local government officials have announced that the IDP camp currently under construction in Missan will soon begin receiving displaced families that are seeking refuge locally in schools. IOM will be constructing cooking and hygiene facilities for the camp, which is expected to open by 18 September.

#### **IOM Distribution Highlights**

On 27 August, the IOM Dahuk team distributed 450 non-food item (NFI) kits in Mangesh, Dahuk. These kits supplied essential items to vulnerable families, who had been without basic supplies for more than 3 weeks. These displaced families left personal effects behind at the start of the crisis, fleeing with just their clothes and ID cards.

Kits give these displaced populations the ability to cook their own meals. NFIs included large water coolers, kerosene cooking stoves, cooking items (pots, pans, dishes and cutlery), mattresses, bedding and towels and other essential household items.
